October General Manager Report 2015

- The first proposed 2015 budget has been completed and is being reviewed by the board of directors.
- I am currently working on getting proposals for the Property & Liability Insurance, as well as Workers Comp, & Directors and Officers for BMLA. I have received two proposals for the employee health insurance for 2015. The proposal for the Geisinger Choice package was the most cost effective for BMLA and the best coverage for the employees.
- The Dredging project has completed the removal of the sediment from the lake. We were able to remove over 4,500 cubic yards of material from the lake. The material from each of the bags has been collected and sent to a lab to be tested by Skelly & Loy Engineering. Once the results from the lab test come back it will determine if the material can be spread on property or if it will have to be hauled away. The material will be spread or removed by the end of November and the documentation to DEP will be filed to receive the remainder of the grant money owed to the Association. The dredging machine is going to be removed from the lake and mobilized out of the community on Thursday October 29th. There may be traffic delays during the process of getting the crane and dredging machine out of the community.
- The adult Halloween party in the restaurant/bar is scheduled for October 30th @ 9:00 PM. Kartune will be the entertainment for this event. We encourage residents to dress up in costumes. We will have cash prizes for our costume contest. The sports club will also be auctioning off baskets of cheer. Tickets for the baskets are available in the restaurant/bar.
- The restaurant will be having a Thanksgiving buffet dinner this year from 11 - 3pm. We do ask that everyone would call for reservations in advance. The restaurant will also be taking orders for Thanksgiving dinner takeout's. Watch the upcoming newsletter for more details.
- The Aqua Edge Rock Drive project is finished with the main line replacement. The crew is working on finishing the remainder of the tie in to each property and is expected to be completed by November 3rd. Base repair to the trench will begin the first week in November and the paving will begin the second week in November.
- In order for the snow plowing contractor to keep our roads clear during the winter months the Association will be enforcing the rules and regulations of BMLA. The covenants read under 13.7 & 13.27.8. Except as provided in the rules and regulations established by the ACC/PCC, NO vehicle shall be parked on any street in the development.
- All residents are responsible for cleaning and maintaining their swales and culvert pipes. Please make sure that your swales and culvert pipes a free of any leaves.
- As of the end of September the Restaurant is at a profit of \$3,260.20.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING
OPEN SESSION
October 28, 2015

CALL TO ORDER: The open session meeting was called to order at 6:32 pm.

ROLL CALL: Those present for the meeting were Kevin Walsh, Mark Duksta, Mark Frumkin, Warren Faust, Lena Fowler, Carly Dickson, Attorney George Hludzik & General Manager Theron Hausman.

BOARD OF DIRECTOR VOTE: Mark Duksta was elected to a 2 year term on the Board of Directors. Mark is currently serving as an appointed Director. Congratulations Mark!

SECRETARY'S REPORT: The October 22, 2014 Annual Meeting minutes were approved. The September 30, 2015 Meeting minutes were also approved.

TREASURER'S REPORT: The Financials for September were reviewed and approved. The Finance Committee did meet in October to review the financials.

LEGAL REPORT: As of October 28, 2015 \$6, 988.18 in dues and collections have been collected so far for the month of October. The amount of \$8,199.91 was collected in September.

QUAIL HOLLOW REPORT: Quail Hollow reported that they are entering their slow season.

MANAGER'S REPORT: The General Manager read the GM report & Maintenance report. Karen Amici read the ACC, CEO, Roving & Security reports. Denise Duksta read the Recreation report.

SPORTS CLUB: The Sports Club reported a great Fall Festival. The Club is also selling Basket Of Fear raffle tickets.

OWNER COMMENTS:

An owner inquired about the swale at Autumn Ln & Four Seasons Dr. The same owner commented about the front entrance looking 'tired'. Perhaps an electronic board for messaging vs. the white boards. Also commented that the Intrepid guards do not appear at times professional and do not give the image of a 'secure' community. One owner did say he often comes into the community at 1:30 am and the Guard always comes out of the office to greet him. The Manager will discuss these concerns with Intrepid. An owner inquired about when the 2016 budget will be available for homeowner review. The Board is still working on the budget. The same owner recommended that the Board get together 2x per month, as a lot of activity seems to occur days before the meeting. The Board commented that a lot of the issues resolved recently are on timelines dictated by AQUA, dredger, etc. and not BML. An owner expressed concern over the enforcement of the 25 mph speed limit. An owner requested a status on the pool roof. The Board approved the new contract during the Executive session and work will be resuming shortly. An owner asked about the driveway sealcoating- the Board voted to change the policy effective 1/1/16 to charge only a \$5 inspection fee for sealcoating if a driveway permit is already on file. If no permit is on file, the ACC will follow their policy regarding 'unauthorized' driveways. An owner asked who complaints should be directed to. The Board responded the General Manager is the contact person for owner complaints. An owner asked about the emergency exit and the additional roads that are coming off of it and how the community would know which road to take to exit. The Board indicated if the emergency exit was needed by BML, the Board & General Manager would coordinate staff at the exit area to direct the residents out of the community.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:10 pm.

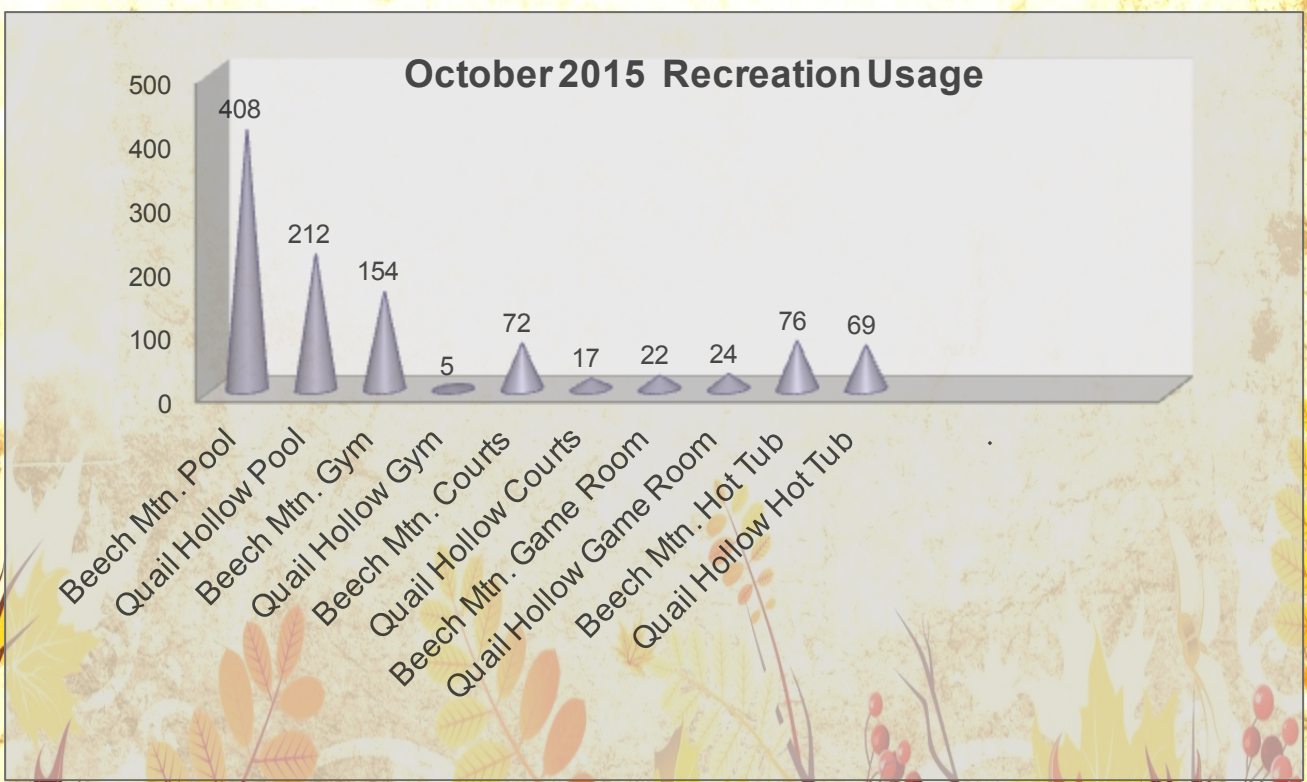

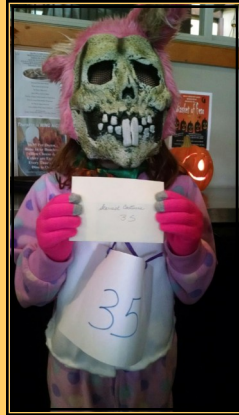

GARDENING CORNER



TIPS FROM PENN STATE MASTER GARDENERS

HELLO BEECH MOUNTAIN GARDENERS!

October provided us with a spectacular show of fall color. Leaves have been especially colorful this year. As days get shorter and temperatures go down, leaves begin to lose chlorophyll as photosynthesis is no longer a necessary process.

Leaf colors come from three different pigments- chlorophyll (producing green), carotenoids (creating yellows and orange) and anthocyanins (reds). While the first two are present in leaves during the growing season, the anthocyanins are usually produced only late in the season, and only under certain circumstances. That is why leaf colors in autumn may or not be as colorful as in former years.

Droughts can delay leaf color change by a few weeks, while wetter and warmer weather may subdue colors, making for a duller fall display. Severe frosts can kill the leaves and produce an early, rapid leaf drop. An autumn that has had abundant warm days and cool nights, like we have had this year, can create a vibrant color display. Of course that colorful show ends up on the ground, giving us all our annual chore of leaf management.

A colleague of mine suggested that entomologists should stop trying to kill gypsy moth caterpillars in June, and just train them to eat leaves in October. Actually there are a lot fewer oak leaves this fall because of the gypsy moth caterpillars. Many of the remaining oak leaves are only half their normal size.



like maple seeds, and now we are seeing an abundance of hickory nuts, ash seeds, and acorns. Some of this abundance is due to a lack of a late freeze this spring. Late freezes tend to kill the developing fruit. If your home is in the vicinity of an oak tree you were treated to a lot of noise from falling acorns.

All these seeds are an important source of food for wildlife. That means more food for our deer population and perhaps some relief for our over grazed landscape plants. White oak acorns are a valuable wildlife food source in fall and winter, as they have less tannins than the red oak group and so are less bitter. Deer, turkeys and bears concentrate in oak stands in years when acorns are especially abundant, as acorns tend to be high in carbohydrates for the energy needed to survive the winter.

Acorns are also an important food source for our native gray squirrels. Some of you may have seen some black squirrels recently. These are a genetic variation of the gray squirrels. They can interbreed with grey squirrels and we will probably be seeing more of this color variant in the future.

PLANT THOSE BULBS!

November usually marks the end of bulb plant season here in the northeast. They need to be planted now to get established before the ground freezes. As always, the best bulbs for planting in Beech Mountain are daffodils. These plants are not eaten by deer because their leaves contain a toxin. There are lots of varieties of daffodils available so you are not limited to the standard yellow flower types. Hyacinths have some limited resistance to deer predation. Tulips are at the top of the deer's favorite food list.



A GOOD YEAR FOR ACORNS

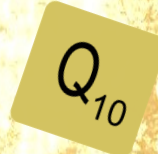
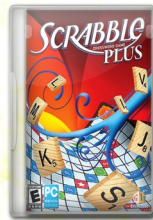
